MORE ABOUT THE ANNUAL MEETING

Why do we have an Annual Meeting?

The By-Laws of Timberline Rim specify that an Annual Meeting of the membership will be held on the last Sunday of September. The agenda normally includes reports from Board members and committees, such as the Architectural Review Committee. A Water Company report is also presented. Members vote on candidates to fill vacant Board positions. In addition, the meeting may include discussion of issues of interest to members.



What Would You Like to Talk About? In addition to reports from committees, the Board of Trustees will offer information on what's happened in the previous year, including the latest financial reports. There are always needs or questions to be addressed.

How do I vote?

The Packet: At least 10 days before the meeting you will receive a packet containing the meeting notice, a ballot for candidates for the Board of Trustees, a Proxy, and two envelopes: a return envelope addressed to the Rim office, and a Ballot Envelope.

The Ballot for candidates needs to be completed and then enclosed in the "Ballot Envelope". The Ballot Envelope must be signed by the voting member and the member's lot number must be entered in the appropriate space on the outside of the envelope. You then seal the Ballot Envelope and place it in the "Return Envelope" and mail it to the Rim office or turn it in at the Annual Meeting. Ballot Envelopes, with signatures of members in good standing*, will be

opened, separated from the ballot to preserve voting confidentiality, and counted.

The Proxy: A proxy form will be included in your packet. Use this form only if you are unable to attend the meeting. To use it, designate on the proxy the member in good standing whom you authorize to vote on your behalf and either give it to the member you have designated as your representative or mail it to the Rim office prior to the Annual Meeting. If you mail it to the office, you may include it in the return envelope. Do not place it in the Ballot Envelope. The sealed Ballot Envelope and the completed proxy may be placed separately in the return envelope.

Voting on Issues at the Meeting: The ballot included in your Annual Meeting packet is only for the purpose of selecting the new members of the Board of Trustees. All other issues will be voted upon by those members in good standing who are present at the meeting, including those who are designated by proxy to act on behalf of other members. When arriving at the meeting, members will register and their eligibility to vote established. All eligible members in good standing will receive voting cards to use on items to be decided by a vote at the meeting.

***A member in good standing is a member who is current on any and all payments to the Rec Club and Water Company, including dues, water fees, and assessments, in accordance with Timberline Rim By-Laws.**
